In most cases, a dermatologist can tell if your skin growth is a seborrheic keratosis by looking at it. Sometimes, a seborrheic keratosis can look like a skin cancer. If it does, the dermatologist will remove the growth so that it can be looked at under a microscope. This is the only way to tell for sure whether a growth is skin cancer.

In adults, seborrheic dermatitis is often a chronic skin condition that comes and goes, often relapsing with specific triggers like stress or in cold, dry climates.

How Seborrheic Dermatitis Is Diagnosed

Seborrheic dermatitis is a clinical diagnosis based on the location and appearance of the lesions. The skin changes are thought to result from an inflammatory response to a common skin organism, Malassezia yeast. Treatment with antifungal agents such as topical ketoconazole is the mainstay of therapy for seborrheic dermatitis of the face and body.

Seborrheic dermatitis affects people of all ages. It keeps recurring, i.e., it goes away for a while and comes back again.

What Triggers Seborrheic Dermatitis?

Seborrheic dermatitis is a lifelong condition that appears, disappears with treatment, and flares up from time to time. Who gets seborrheic dermatitis? About 11% of the population has seborrheic dermatitis. It occurs most often in infants younger than three months old and in adults ages 30 to 60.

The diagnosis of seborrheic dermatitis is usually made clinically, meaning that the doctor recognizes it on the basis of its appearance. Occasionally,

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a scraping of skin scales treated with potassium hydroxide is examined using a microscope to exclude a fungal infection. A skin biopsy is rarely required for diagnosis.
