Alternatively, you can right-click the internet icon in the taskbar (next to the clock) and select Open Network & Internet settings. In Windows XP, change to Category view, select Network and Internet Connections > Network Connections, then skip to Step 4.

### How to Enable or Disable Network Connections in Windows

Open Control Panel > System and Security and select Allow an app through Windows Firewall. In the list of applications, locate Windows GUI Symbolic Debugger and Windows Kernel Debugger. Use the check boxes to allow those two applications through the firewall. Scroll down and select OK, to save the firewall changes.

Step 1. Note that if buying a router, all routers are compatible with Windows XP. It is wireless adapters that have varying levels of Windows XP compatibility.
